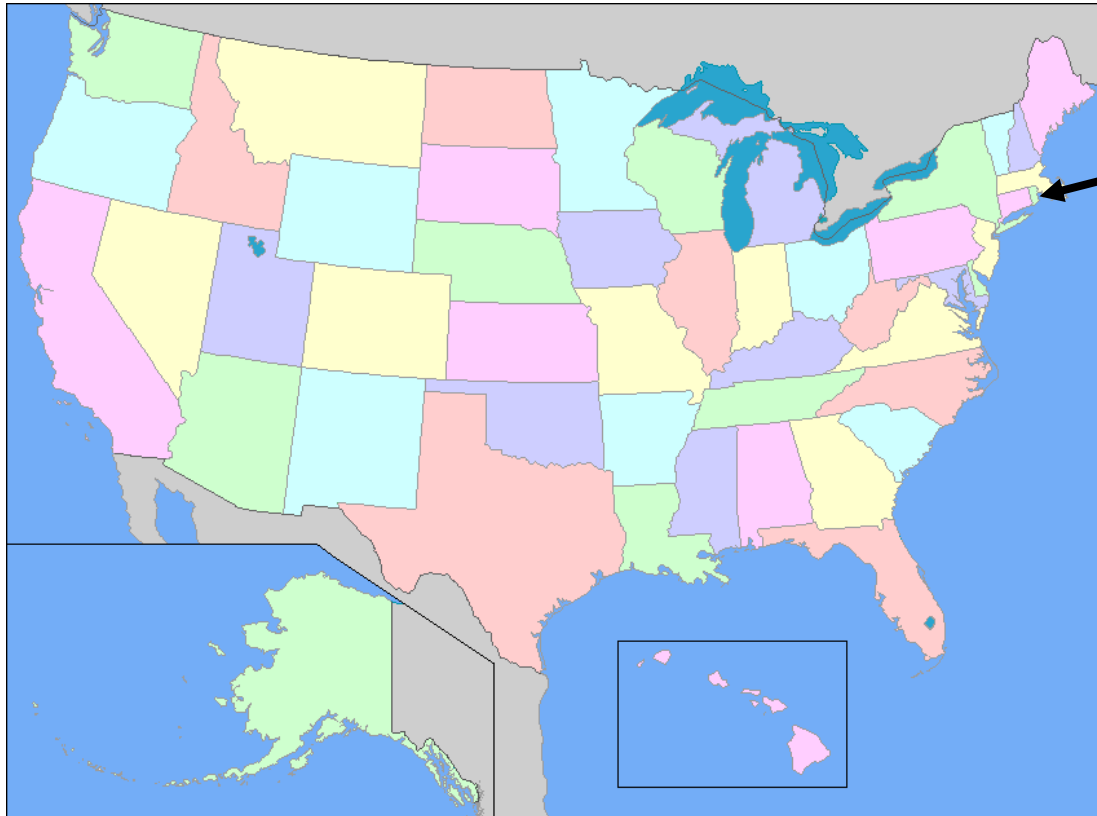

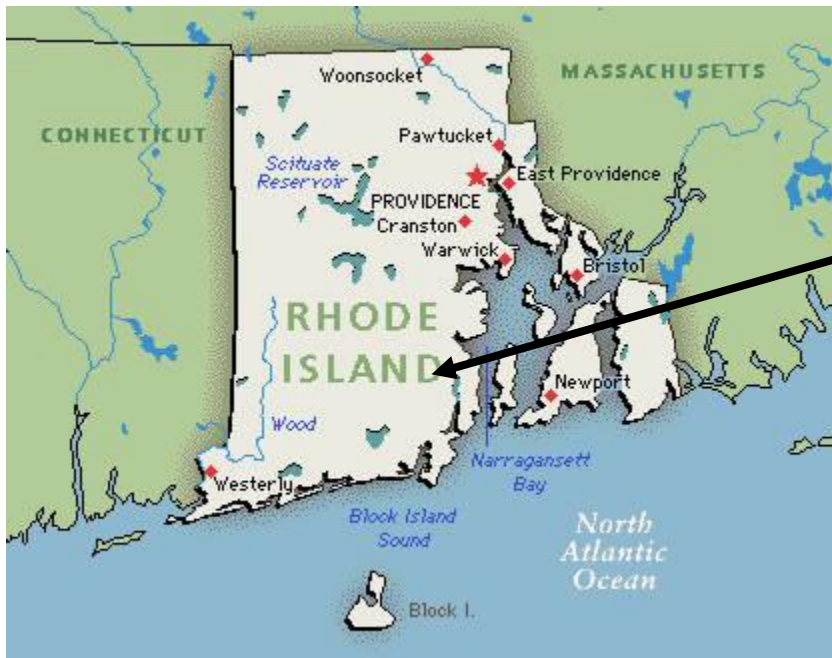

Rhode Island

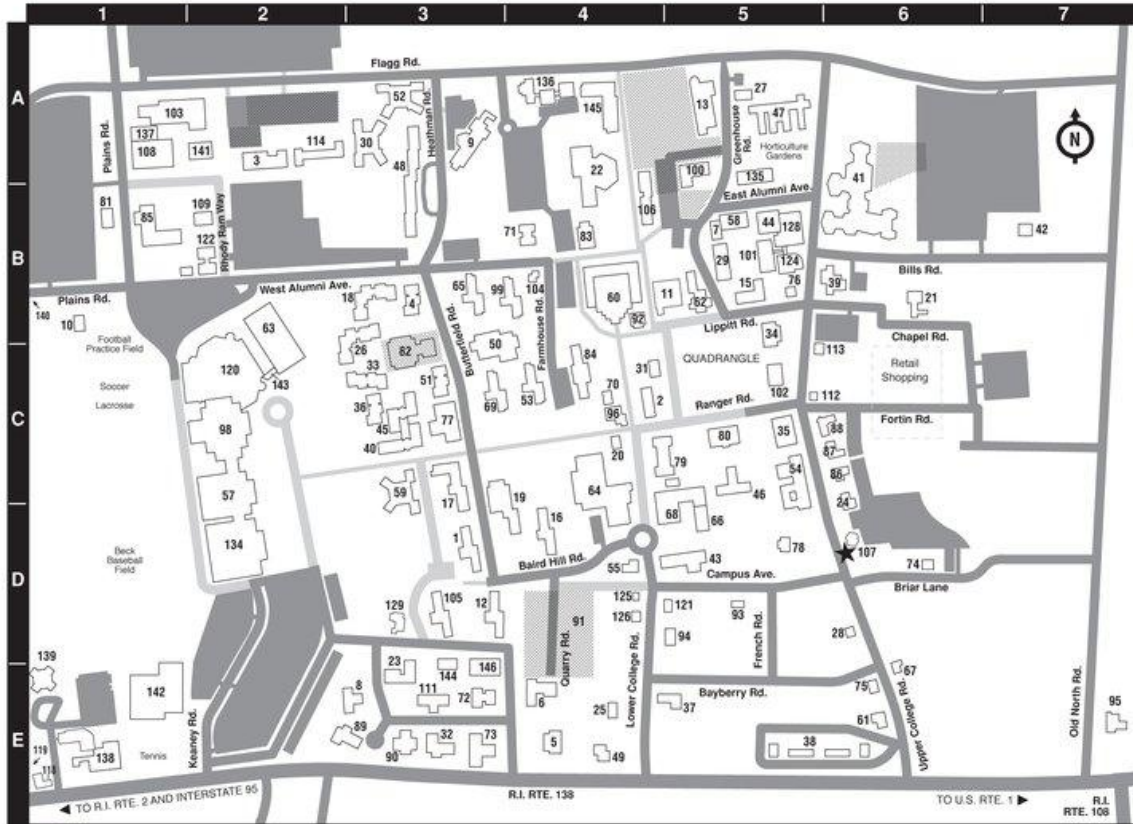

### Campus Access Office

The Access office is responsible for ID cards and Meal Plan Transactions. The office creates ID cards for students. The ID card contains your name, student ID number and photo. If you put money onto your ram account, you will need this card to access the money. It acts as a credit card in this way. You put money onto your card and swipe it when you want to use the money. There is a machine outside of the campus access office to use when you want to add money onto your account. There are many facilities on campus as well as in the emporium that will accept ram account as a payment.

### Library

The 3 story library is located near the northwest corner of the Quadrangle. Here students can search for books and articles using the online catalog or the numerous research databases available. Library staff is available to help students in person or via phone. Computers are available throughout the building as well as individual and group study rooms. There are copying/printing/scanning machines available throughout the building.

The Information and Instructional Technology Services Department is also located on the lower level of the library in room LL4. The helpdesk here can assist with computer and networking issues. The phone number is 401-URI-HELP (401-874-4357). Their summer hours are Monday to Friday 8am-5pm.

## The Kingston Emporium

## Local Attractions

### Wakefield

Located 5 miles from Kingston, Wakefield is the closest town to campus. Main street Wakefield is a great place to hang out and meet local people.

Must do's in Wakefield:

1. Walk or ride a bike along the bike path that starts at the Kingston train station
2. Visit the Mew's for a great local restaurant.
3. Try Brickley's for some ice cream.

### Narragansett

Located 10-15 minutes from URI, Narragansett runs along the coast of the bay. When URI students go to Narragansett, they refer to it as going "down the line" because all of the beaches here are located on a line along Route 1A.

Must do's in Narragansett:

1. Take a trip to the beach.
2. Try clam cakes from Iggy's.
3. Take the ferry from Point Judith to Block Island.

### Newport

A huge tourist location in the summer, Newport is located on the water and has many beaches, restaurants and shops.

Must do's in Newport:

1. The Newport Cliff Walk – walk along the cliff's edge where to your left you have scenic views of the beach and ocean and to your right there are views of the many mansions of Newport.
2. Visit the Touro Synagogue – this is the oldest synagogue in the United States.
3. Visit the beach.
4. Try RI clam chowder or quahogs.

### Providence

The state capital of RI, Providence is located 35 minutes north of Kingston. Public transportation is available via theRIPTA buses that come to the circle outside the memorial union.

Must do's in Providence:

1. Watch a Providence Water Fire show that occurs on select Saturday nights during the summer.
2. Visit Thayer Street – a popular shopping and eating street in Providence.
3. See a show at the Providence Performing Arts Center (PPAC).
4. See the animals at the Roger Williams Park Zoo.
