Academics

Oral English Skills Course

The primary focus of this course is oral communication. Course content emphasizes an introduction to American culture and intercultural communication. Students build fluency in English by participating in oral discussions based on course readings and giving oral presentations on a variety of cultural topics. Additionally, students enhance intercultural awareness by reflecting on differences between America and their own country.

Students will take this course two hours a day.

Topics Include:

- Introduction to the United States
- Relationships in America
- American Heritage
- Education and Business in America



Special Topics in Global Enterprise Management Lean Systems, Quality Assurance, Supply Chain & Logistics

This course introduces students to the fundamentals and advancements in lean systems, quality assurance, and supply chain management & logistics. Students will also be provided with lab experiences and visits to local businesses related to these topics.

Students will take this course three hours a day.
